W	hat is Expository Preaching?
a.	Definition: An expository sermon makes the main point of the passage the main point of the sermon, and then applies it to the life of the congregation.
b.	The Unique Power of Expository Preaching
	i. It uniquely respects the way God has presented himself in the Scriptures.
	ii. It uniquely builds the church on the Word & Gospel.
	iii. It uniquely emphasizes the preaching event as one-way reception.
	iv. It uniquely encourages a culture of expository ministries within the church.
