WAYS TO PRAY THIS WEEK:

Hope for the Lost: Pray that during this Christmas season many will receive the good news of great joy that the angel proclaimed to the shepherds long ago and find true hope in the Savior, who is Christ the Lord (Luke 2:10-11). Pray that those currently walking in darkness will see a great light (Isaiah 9:2) and follow the one who is the Light of the World (John 8:12). As we celebrate Christmas with family and friends, pray that we would be ready to share the hope of Christmas with those around us.

Hope for the Hurting: Pray for those in our church family who are hurting, suffering, discouraged, depressed, lonely, hopeless, etc. this Christmas. Ask for true comfort to come to those who have lost loved ones recently, that they may truly know that the LORD is near them (Psalm 34:18). Pray for those whose health is failing that they may find healing and be strengthened with all power according to His glorious might (Colossians 1:11). Pray for the grace to rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, and be constant in prayer (Romans 12:12) even the midst of great difficulties.

Hope for the Needy: Pray for those in our community and those around the world who are poor and oppressed. Ask that they may find hope in the one who came to proclaim good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to the captives, and set at liberty those who are oppressed (Luke 4:18-19). Pray that we as Christians will be intentional and diligent to share the world's goods with all in need and especially with our brothers and sisters in Christ (James 2:14-17, 1 John 3:17). Pray that the poor will receive the Kingdom of God, that the hungry will be satisfied, and that those who are currently weeping will very soon be laughing (Luke 6:20-21).

Hope for the Nations: Pray that people from all nations will come to the one who was born King of the Jews and fall down in worship before him (Matthew 2:1-2, 11). Pray that those in unlikely places will rejoice exceedingly with great joy because Christ has come (Matthew 2:10) and he is a Savior for all the peoples. Rejoice that by his blood, Jesus has ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation (Revelation 5:9).

The mission of Faith Church is to make more and better disciples here and around the world.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Confession of Sin & Prayer of Confession

God commands His people to continually confess their sins to Him (1 John 1:9). The service leader will lead us in a moment of confession (often a short time of silence for self-examination and private confession). This may also include a scripture reading, a responsive prayer of confession, or a corporate prayer of confession that the service leader will lead. We want to be a people who continually repent of their sins and experience the mercy of God! Lean into this moment.
