



WAYS TO PRAY THIS WEEK:

Jesus' Return: As we continue in Mark 13, we are studying the events around Jesus' glorious return. Pray that we will have endurance and hold fast to Christ while we eagerly wait and watch for him to come (Mark 13:13, 27, 37). In addition to this, the refrain in Revelation is to be eech Jesus to come back (Rev. 22:20). Ask the Lord to bring about the completion of the story of redemption – that he will come quickly in power and resurrect those who have died in Christ

Hope for the Needy: Pray for those in our community and those around the world who are poor and oppressed. Ask that they may find hope in the one who came to proclaim good news to the poor, proclaim liberty to the captives, and set at liberty those who are oppressed (Luke 4:18-19). Pray that we as Christians will be intentional and diligent to share the world's goods with all in need and especially with our brothers and sisters in Christ (James 2:14-17, 1 John 3:17). Pray that the poor will receive the Kingdom of God, that the hungry will be satisfied and that those who are currently weeping will very soon be laughing (Luke 6:20-21).

Our Children & Youth: Thank God for the children and youth of our church! Pray that we would see them as a gift from the Lord and an integral part of our church family. Pray that our children will come to Jesus and enter his kingdom (Matt. 10:13-16). Pray their parents would be faithful to raise them in the fear and instruction of the Lord (Eph. 6:4). Pray for protection against the schemes of the devil and the pressures of the world that are especially challenging to our youth (Eph. 6:11). Pray that they will flee youthful passions and pursue righteousness, faith, love, and peace (2 Tim. 2:22).

Our Faith: Pray that our faith will continue to increase and grow (Luke 17:5, Romans 4:20). Ask that by his grace, we will trust in the good news and the many promises of his word so that we may receive all the intended benefits (Hebrews 4:2). Pray that as we face various trials our faith will prove genuine and result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:7). Even though we cannot see him with our eyes now, pray that we will believe in him and rejoice with inexpressible and glorious joy as we receive the goal of our faith, the salvation of our souls (1 Peter 1:8).

The mission of Faith Church is to make more and better disciples here and around the world.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Assurance of Pardon

After the confession, there will be an assurance of pardon moment. Often this will be taken from the scriptures. assuring Christians that God has pardoned their guilt, taken their sin away, and accepts them as His children forever (Ps. 103:1-8; Lk. 7:48-50; Jn. 3:16-17). Open your heart, each week, to be reminded of God's gracious pardon.
